



WHAT IF THE MAP VAN DIDN'T OPERATE DURING THE DAY?

Imagine needing help but not having a phone to make a call or not having access to transportation. Imagine not being able to access the very hyper-local service bubble that is the Downtown Eastside. Thanks to the MAP Van, WISH has been able to develop unique and long-standing relationships with a diverse community of street-based sex workers across Vancouver, particularly since the addition of a day shift.

Since expanding the hours last June, the MAP Van has been able to reach a new community of street-based sex workers who face extreme barriers to accessing supports. While day shifts began as an entirely new time period for MAP Van services, within one month of operation the day shift was already seeing equal, if not greater, numbers of sex workers as the night shift.

It quickly became clear how crucial the day shift is in connecting this hard-to-reach segment of our community with necessary—and often lifesaving—services. Losing the new day shift would significantly damage participant's trust in the reliability and accessibility of our services. We owe it to them to continue to physically, and philosophically, embody the core principles of harm reduction in meeting them where they are at.

Since the MAP Van day shift began operating on June 15, 2020, the staff have:



Connected with street-based sex workers more than **7,300** times



Given out approx. **17,000** food and drink items



Given out approx. **15,000** condoms



Given out approx. **150,000** sterile needles, safer smoking kits, and other harm reduction supplies

A YEAR IN PANDEMIC: PROVIDING ESSENTIAL SERVICES IN TIMES OF CHAOS

2020 proved to be a year like no other. And now, 2021 seems to be headed in the same direction. More than a year into a global pandemic, street-based sex workers continue to fall through the cracks. COVID-19, coupled with the ongoing opioid crisis, homelessness, and inequitable rates of targeted violence and discrimination against street-based sex workers means women need WISH's programs and services more than ever.

Our kitchen served **more than 100,000** meals



The MAP Van connected with street-based sex workers **almost 18,000** times



Our shelter has been **at capacity** since opening day



Sadly, on average, **19 women** are turned away from the shelter **every day**



The MAP Van handed out **more than 85,000** sterile needles



Twice as many peers are working in the Supportive Employment Program

It’s been more than a year since we expanded the hours of the Drop-In to remain open 24/7, created an outdoor safe respite area, introduced peer witnessing to prevent accidental overdoses, installed a 5-toilet washroom trailer in our backlot, and added a crucial day shift to our MAP Van.

Regrettably, only a few months into 2021, we continue to see that work has dried up. Street-based sex workers have fewer options to refuse unsafe work, are cut off from income replacement supports, and continue to experience higher levels of gender-based and sexualized violence, as well as a worsening overdose crisis. But, with your help, women in Vancouver’s street-based sex trade can continue to receive essential services from WISH in times of chaos.

As the Downtown Eastside continues to grapple with multiple pandemics, your support is crucial in ensuring sex workers do not face a claw back in services. Please consider giving the gift of positive options and opportunities to those who don’t often have them.
